Student Responsibilities

All Forms and Requirements may be brought in earlier.

- **Enrollment Promise** – Signed by Parent & Student - Due this evening.
- **Student Attendance at Retreat is Required** – Friday October 17th 2025
6:00 pm to approximately 9:00 pm in the gym. Student MUST be accompanied by an adult preferably their sponsor. It is understood if sponsor is younger than 18 years old.
- **Letter to Fr. Tom** – Why do you want to be confirmed? How have you prepared and how will you continue preparing?
Due December 7th 8th 9th 2025 (Depending on class day)
- **Saint Report** – Students will choose a Saint Name for Confirmation. This report is research on their chosen Saint. Please see attached.
Due February 1st 2nd 3rd 2026 (Depending on class day)
- **Sponsor Interview**– This project is interactive. It's to be an interview, not a form to give to the sponsor for sponsor to fill out. Suggested questions are attached.
Due February 8th 9th 10th 2026 (Depending on class day)
- **Gifts of the Spirit Project** – A Drawing, Collage, Painting, etc. or a handwritten or computer-generated piece showing the Gifts of The Holy Spirit.
Due February 22nd 23rd 24th 2026 (Depending on class day)
- **Christian Service** – Each student will be required to perform 10 hours of Christian Service (Please see attached)
The Form and Reflection Due March 1st 2nd 3rd 2026 (Depending on class day)
- **Regular Attendance at Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation.** On the first day of class a small notebook will be supplied for a Homily Journal.

There will be a One Hour Sacramental Preparation session in the church on Tuesday February 17th 2026 at 7:15 pm for both Students and Parent (or parents)

Students will attend 11:00 am Mass with teachers as a group on Sunday the week before Confirmation and there will be a second one-hour preparation session following mass. Parents are welcome but not required.

Practice during the week before Confirmation – The sponsors are required to attend the practice. If a sponsor cannot be there, a parent may stand in. (Date will be e-mailed and posted on the webpage).

Fr. Tom will hear individual confessions before Confirmation during classes.

Students are required to become familiar with the Confirmation Questions / Answers about our faith. They can be found on the St. Clement Religious Education Website: stclementreligious.org

Confirmation Day Dress Code Requirements:

All students and sponsors must be neatly and appropriately dressed.

Girls: Dress, skirt and blouse or dress slacks, dress shoes. Dresses and skirts must be of the appropriate length for Church.

Boys: Dress pants or khakis with button down shirt and dress shoes.

Students will wear robes – the girls, white, the boys red. The robes will be distributed the week before Confirmation during class. Following the ceremony, students will return the robes and will receive their Confirmation certificates.

- 6) When you think about the Church, what are the first thoughts or images that come to mind?
- 7) Can you tell me about a time when you felt the Holy Spirit at work in your life?
- 8) Who is the person that has most influenced you in your relationship with Jesus?
- 9) In what ways might you be able to help me as my Sponsor during my preparation for Confirmation and in my spiritual life beyond that day?

8th Grade Christian Service

Students preparing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation are required to perform **10 hours of Christian Service**. It is our hope that you will look upon these 10 hours as the beginning of a lifelong commitment to Christian service and find it to be a privilege, not a burden. Service is discipleship in action and an important element of your lifelong faith journey.

Of course, Christian Service means not accepting money from those you help.

Parents are encouraged to stay with their children wherever they are performing their service hours. Parents bear responsibility for any safety concerns should they choose to “drop off” their children wherever service hours are being performed.

Volunteer to work in a hospital

Tutor after school

Shop for an elderly neighbor or relative

Do yard work at the school or parish

Join a service group

Write cards or letters to hospitalized children or teens

Collect food for the poor

Help with a fund raising project for a charitable organization

Collect, clean, and repair clothing for the poor

Earn money for the missions by washing cars, babysitting, etc.

Work at a food bank

Serve as a teacher's aid

Perform special services for the handicapped

Prepare a meal or dessert for a family whose parent or child has died

Collect toys for poor children

Read to the blind

Make audiotapes for the blind or elderly

Make gifts or favors for hospitals or nursing homes

Prepare entertainment or holiday parties for nursing homes or child care centers

Collect and deliver magazines to the emergency waiting rooms, hospital waiting rooms, etc.

Coach or assist with young children's sports activities.
